
Stockinbingal Hotels

Carrington Hotel, 1905.




Livery stables at the Carrington Hotel, 1900.



The Carrington Hotel was purchased by Thomas Ellwood from Fred West in November 1909. In 1911 Ellwood enlarged the hotel to two storeys and included 17 rooms upstairs. In 1913 he added a wing and Ellwood's Hall in Martin Street. Thomas Ellwood retained the licence till 1921.




Stockinbingal Hotel. **Built 1888 by Edward Woodhouse for David White (1st owner).** Licence transferred to Oswald Edward Murray, Mr & Mrs Simons, J. O'Brien, W. Ayers, Mr & Mrs Platton of Canada, W.Gow, Bert Cooley, T.F.Ellwood. Licence was surrendered 26 April 1934 and hotel closed by Licences Reduction Board. The hotel is still located today at the eastern end of Martin St.
